General remarks:

This Eurasian (EuroAsian) meeting has the goal to bring together those European and Asian heterocyclic chemists from our continent who had no real contacts with each other up to now. We warmly welcome scientists from Western and Asian parts of Russia, India, China, Arabic countries, South Asia, Japan, Eastern and Western Europe.

The previous such meeting, held in Suzdal (Russia) in 2000 was our first successful attempt to establish such intra-continental links. According to the desire of all participants of the first meeting, the International Advisory Board has decided to organize such meeting in the year 2002 again in Russia. Russia is a unique place where Europe and Asia meet one another, and the ancient town Novgorod the Great with its old architecture, many beautiful monasteries and churches, is the spirit of Russia.

Velikiy Novgorod (Novgorod the Great) is a town, founded in the middle of the 10th century with its unique architectural ensemble. It is located not far from St.Petersburg.

Transportation:

The town Velikiy Novgorod is not far from St.Petersburg (3-4 hours by bus). It takes one night to get Velikiy Novgorod by train from Moscow. There are also regular night trains Moscow-St.Petersburg and back (one night in train) if you decide to visit both these two famous Russian cities.

Arrival:

- (1) If you arrive to Moscow international airport Sheremetyevo, the organizers will meet you and accompany your transportation to the railway station. Latest departure of the train (Moscow - Velikiy Novgorod) will be on September 11, evening.
- (2) If you arrive to St. Petersburg international airport the organizers will meet you and accompany your transportation to Velikiy Novgorod. Latest bus will be September 12, morning.

Departure:

By conference bus to St. Petersburg city center on September 17, afternoon.
By train to Moscow railway station „Leningradskiy Vokzal“ on September 17, evening
Please, inform organizers about your arrival and departure day / time as early as possible, so that we book your train tickets and reserve bus seats in advance. If necessary, we may help you to book hotels in Moscow and St.Petersburg hotels for your staying before and/or after the meeting

TITLE (in capital, centered)
Name (in bold, centered)

Body of the text (justified)
[1] References (justified)
